Purpose - provide a comprehensive district wide look at all facilities and instructional program needs; establish project priorities (short and long term); develop a long range plan for the preservation and use of our school facilities; assess facilities needs over a five year period; develop a cyclical repair/replacement schedule; review and prioritize District's 5-year Capital Improvement Plan.

The District has undertaken the New York State Education (NYSED) requirement to update their Building Condition Survey (BCS) plan in 2021 which will be submitted to NYSED in March 2022.

The requirement of the BCS is to identify all needs of the facilities to be fixed, repaired or replaced in the next five years. Items must be identified on this list or Facilities Planning at NYSED will not aid the work to fix, repair or replace.



Paving, concrete, drainage, roofs, fireproof doors, waste water treatment plant Priority level 2

Next Steps

July – August – Architect and Construction Manager firm up the costs
August – September – LRP meets to review and accept
October – Full Board approves both a vote and SEQR review
December 7th – anticipated vote date

Anticipated Next Steps – after the vote

December 2021 – September 2022 – Architect design

September 2022 – January 2023 – Project submitted to NYSED for review & approval

February 2023 – March 2023 – bids sent out, reviewed and awarded

July 2023 – anticipated construction start
