| Meeting held via zoom. Members Present: Lorrie Burrows, Shawn Clark, Mike Hale, Jesse Williams & Lynn Rhone  |
| Community Members present: Mark Mattison, Tom Olsen, Christine Crowley. Lorrie discussed the budget impacts on the revenue/expenditure side and the impact from a potential outlay project. Christine Crowley from Fiscal Advisors then explained a potential \$8m, \$18m & \$34m project and how each of those would impact the budget. The operating budget utilizes revenue from capital projects to offset expenditures. If taxpayers were to turn down a building capital project it would ultimately effect the revenue of the the operating budget. Discussion was held regarding transportation aid. A memo was received from the State Education Department regarding reimbursement for school districts for  |
| <b>Discussion:</b>   |
| March through June of 2020 when the Governor closed down schools due to COVID 19 on March 16, 2020. The State Education Department is stating that even though we still paid employees for transportation and food service because the Governor told us we had to the State Ed laws say that we are not eligible for payment of aid because we did not transport children. The financial implication to the district is approximately \$400,000.00. Multiple lobbying groups including NYSSBA, NYSUT, NYSCOSS etc are reaching out to the state regarding this. They are pushing for if it happens at all that it would be done utilizing the 5/1/2020 date when the Governor said we would not be returning at all for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year which would then result in a loss of approximately \$200,000.00 in aid funding. |
| There has been less talk about a 20% take back on aid but they are finding other ways around it like above.  |
