## **Assisting Oswego County Youth**

The purpose of youth services in Oswego County is to assist youth to achieve academic and employment success. This is accomplished by providing information to eligible youth on the array of services available through the One-Stop Center and the local community. Our staff also help youth meet their needs by providing appropriate referrals and services.

Each youth will participate in an objective assessment to examine academic and occupational skill levels and individual service needs. An individual service plan will be completed for each youth which will incorporate the assessment findings and identify a career goal.

#### **Overarching Goals:**

- Ensure high school completion and graduation
- Return to school to obtain TASC (high school equivalency) for those who have dropped out
- Encourage post-secondary education (college or vocational training)
- Obtain employment

#### **Program Description:**

- Improve education and skill competencies
- Develop education and employment goals
- Make the connection between school and work
- Provide effective links to the labor market

#### **Program Eligibility:**

- 16-24 years old
- US Citizen or legally authorized to work in the United States
- Low income based on federal guidelines
- Possess one or more barriers to employment
